How to Keep a Proverbs Notebook

The Book of Proverbs has 31 chapters and can be easily read by doing one chapter each day.

Whichever date it is, read that chapter of Proverbs.

Example: On the 5th of the month, read chapter 5. On the 23rd of the month, read chapter 23.

Do not try to "catch up" on chapters if you miss a day—just read that day's chapter of Proverbs.

The simplest notebook is **to write your favorite verse** from the chapter. The next month when you read through, choose a different favorite verse. At the end of the year, you will have 12 verses written from each chapter.

Or, for more of a challenge, look for different themes each time you read through the book, and write the verses you find in your notebook. Here are some common themes:

- "My son..."
- Wisdom
- Money
- Friends
- Speaking
- Heart matters
- Women
- Fools
- Work

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
