Day 2

Read Psalm 110. Who wrote this Psalm?

Write the verses that describe how God treats the nations.

Look up each of the following references in the New Testament and write the
verse from Psalm 110 that is being quoted:

Matthew 22:41-46, Acts 2:34-35, Romans 8:34, I Corinthians 15:25, Hebrews 5:6
and Hebrews 6:20 and 8:1

Day 3

Review your notes from Jeremiah 25 and 46-51.

Look up Romans 12:17-13:7. How does the reality of God's future plan affect the
behavior of the believer when they are being mistreated now?

Write ways you can do this in your life.

Day 4

Review Jeremiah 45 and the message to Baruch.

Look up each of the following references in the New Testament and write how it is connected to the message Baruch was given by God.

Matthew 6:19-21, Matthew 10:16-42, II Peter 3:1-11 and I John 2:15-17

Day 5

Make a "Jeremiah Hymnbook" by writing down the title of at least one hymn or chorus that speaks to each of the following themes of Jeremiah:

- God's unchanging Word. (The Almond Branch)
- God's coming judgment. (The Boiling Pot)
- God's mercy. (Basket of Good Figs)
- God's encouragement of hope during trials and discipline. (The Letter, Book, Deed)
- The restoration of Israel to the land (The Letter, Book, Deed)
- Submitting to God's will and way. (The Yoke, The Letter)
- The future reign of Jesus over the nations (David's Righteous Branch. hint: Joy to the World last stanza!)
- Living for what is eternal, not what is temporal. (Message to Baruch)
