Give God's portion FIRST. Don't pay all your other bills first to see if you will "have enough" for God. Failing to give God's portion is stealing from Him.

God is no man's debtor. Those who honor Him with their wealth will find their needs met.

Honor the Lord from your wealth and from the first of all your produce; So your barns will be filled with plenty and your vats will overflow with new wine. Proverbs 3:9-10



Have a giving mindset and you will not begrudge someone who has a need that you can meet. Don't refuse to give to your friend's obvious need because it might mess up your budget. Don't forget to factor in God's unexpected meeting of your needs when looking at your expenses. There will still be enough "tomorrow" if you give today. Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due when it is in your power to do it.

Do not say to your neighbor, "Go, and come back, and tomorrow I will give it," when you have it with you. Proverbs 3:27-28

How to Keep a Proverbs Notebook

The Book of Proverbs has 31 chapters and can be easily read by doing **one chapter each day**.

Whichever date it is, read that chapter of Proverbs. Example: On the 5th of the month, read chapter 5. On the 23rd of the month, read chapter 23.

Do not try to "catch up" on chapters if you miss a day—just read that day's chapter of Proverbs.

The simplest notebook is **to write your favorite verse** from the chapter. The next month when you read through, choose a different favorite verse. At the end of the year, you will have 12 verses written from each chapter.

Or, for more of a challenge, **look for different themes** each time you read through the book, and write the verses you find in your notebook. Here are some common themes:

- "My son..."
- Wisdom
- Money
- Friends
- Speaking
- Heart matters
- Women
- Fools
- Work
